


## Charlie Coal the Grill™




#### Thank you for choosing this unique PLAYSKOOL brand product!

Batteries included. Replace with 3 x I.5V "AA" or LR6 size alkaline batteries. Phillips/cross head screwdriver (not included) required to replace batteries.


### **TO ASSEMBLE**

Connect the legs to the grill by snapping the pegs into the holes on the base. This is a one-time assembly.



### **TO REPLACE BATTERIES**

Use a Phillips/cross head screwdriver (not included) to loosen screw in battery compartment door as shown (screw remains attached to door). Remove and discard old batteries. Insert 3 fresh I.5V "AA" or LR6 size alkaline batteries. Replace door and tighten screw.





NOTE: This toy is packaged in "demo" mode. To enable full features, switch to "play" mode located on the bottom of the grill.



NOTE: The grill will automatically shut off after a period of inactivity. When storing toy, turn the switch to "OFF" to prevent accidental activation.

### **PLAY FEATURES**



This special toy says over 50 fun phrases and sounds. Here's how to activate them:

Press the front button to start speech and fun sound effects. Charlie Coal's eyes and mouth will also move!

Place a "food" item on the grill surface and lightly press on it to start speech and fun sound effects.

Place the ketchup, mustard, fork or spatula in the front holders as shown. The grill will recognize which accessory or condiment is in each holder and will talk to them! Items can also be placed in side holders for storage.

- 5. Do not short circuit the supply terminals.
