




Join the farmer and his animal friends and sing along to the classic children's song, "Old MacDonald Had a Farm."

TO REPLACE BATTERIES

Use a Phillips screwdriver to loosen screw in battery compartment door (screw remains attached to door).
Remove door. Insert 3 fresh "AA"/LR6 alkaline batteries. Replace door and tighten screw.
