



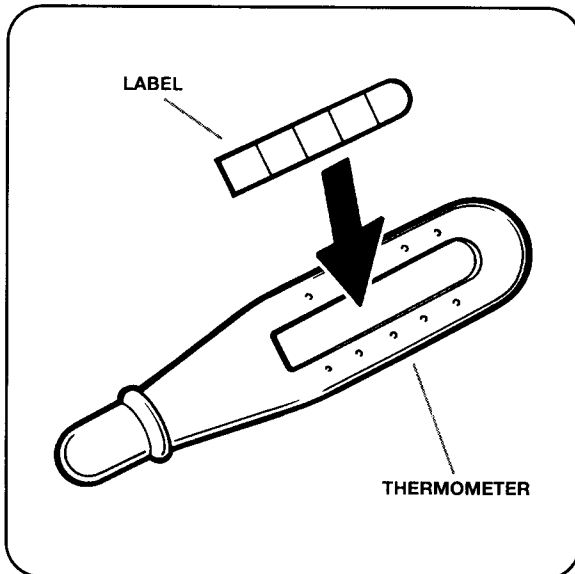
Medical Rescue Instructions

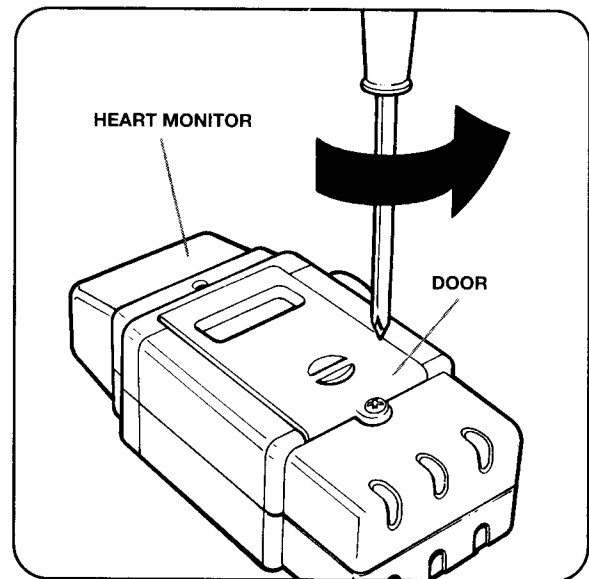

TO APPLY LABEL

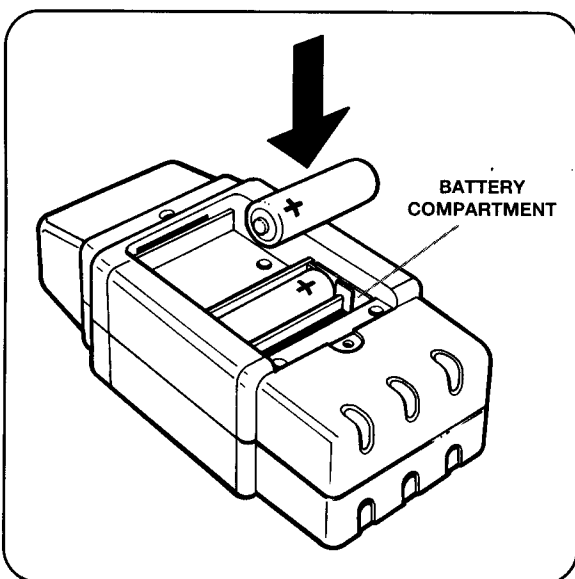


1. Apply label to thermometer as shown.

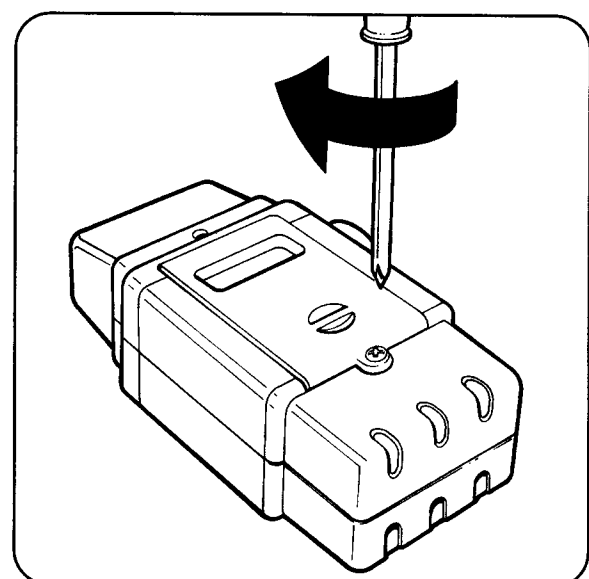
TO INSERT BATTERIES INTO HEART MONITOR



1. Using a Phillips® screwdriver, remove screw from battery compartment door in heart monitor. Remove door.



2. Insert 2 "AA" alkaline batteries into battery compartment as shown.

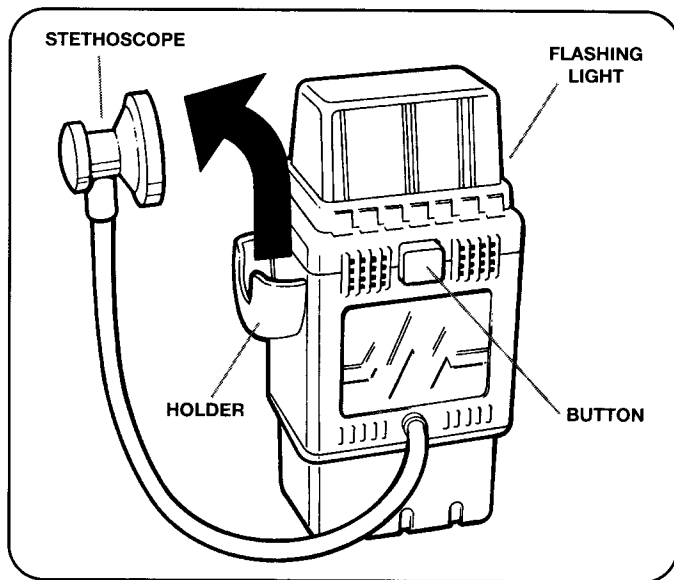


3. Replace door. Replace and re-tighten screw.

CAUTION: TO AVOID BATTERY LEAKAGE:

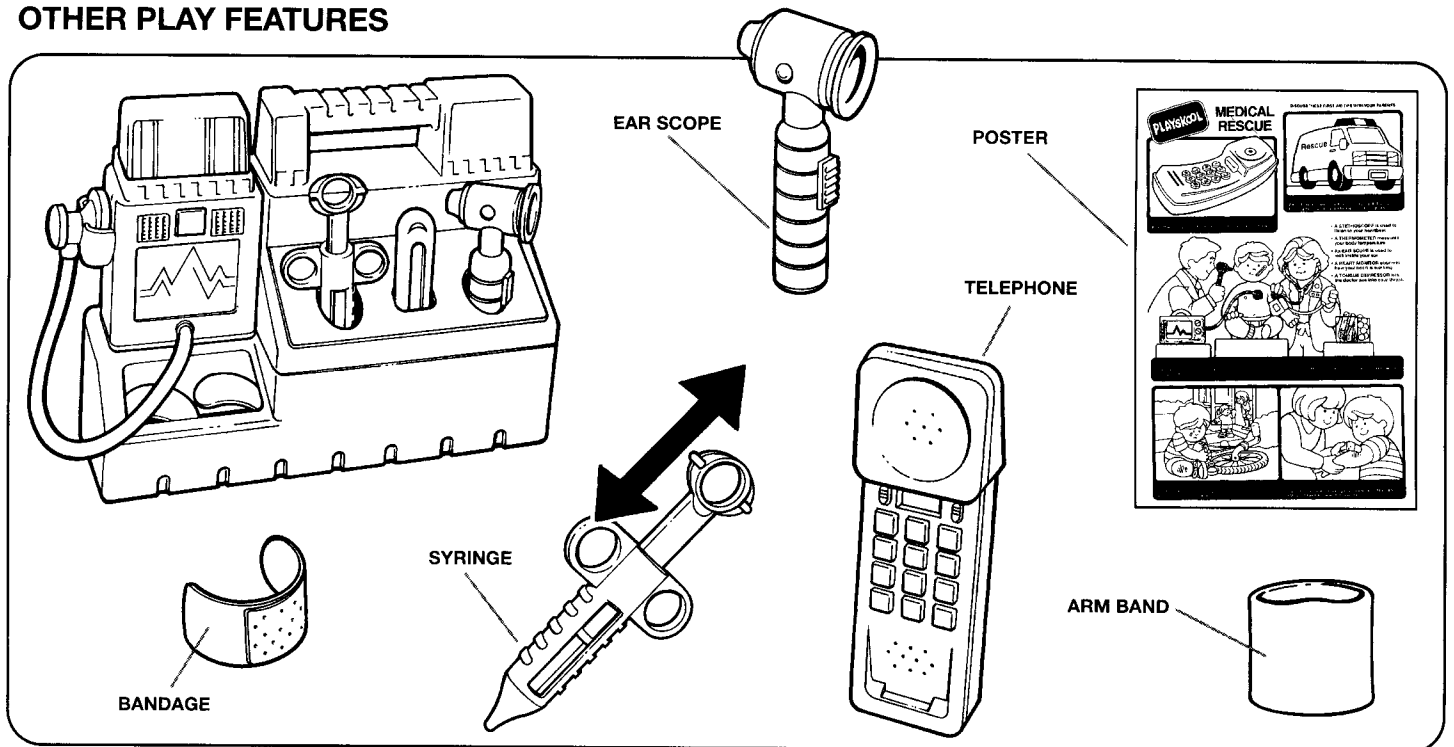
1. Be sure to insert the batteries correctly and always follow the toy and battery manufacturers' instructions.
2. Never mix old batteries and new batteries, or standard (carbon-zinc) with alkaline batteries.
3. Always remove exhausted or dead batteries from the product.
4. Remove batteries if product is stored for a long period of time.

TO OPERATE HEART MONITOR



1. Remove the end of the stethoscope from the holder on the side of the heart monitor to hear a heartbeat sound and see a flashing light, as shown.
Note: The light flashes longer when the stethoscope is removed slowly from the holder.
2. When the heartbeat sound and flashing light stop, press the button to hear the siren and see the emergency light flash!
3. Note: If you press the button before the heartbeat sound and flashing light stop, the emergency light will flash, and the siren will begin AFTER the heartbeat sound completes its cycle.

OTHER PLAY FEATURES



1. Syringe: Pull the handle up and push it down to give pretend injections to patients.
2. Ear scope: Look through the ear scope to check ears.
3. Telephone: Press the buttons to make pretend phone calls.
4. Bandages: Place the bandage on patients to cover pretend wounds.
5. Arm band: Adjust the easy fasteners on the arm band to wear it when taking care of patients.
6. We encourage you to read the safety poster and discuss it with your family to find out what to do in different emergency situations.

Here are some safety devices we'd like you to know about:

- Smoke detectors help warn of a fire.
- Bicycle helmets can reduce the seriousness of falls.
- Ground-fault circuit interrupters can prevent accidental electrocution or electric shock injuries.
- Fences with gates that automatically close and latch can prevent children from wandering into pool areas.
- Safety latches on doors and drawers help keep children away from medicines, cleaners and other hazardous items.
- Anti-scald devices are available for tap water faucets.
- Spring-loaded supports can be purchased to keep toy chest lids from dropping on children.
