# Memory

## For 1 to 4 Players

Another game in the popular MEMORY series that's lots of fun to play. You and your opponents try to match cards with pictures on your gameboards. Matches must be made in exact order, from left to right because each sequence tells a story. When a match is made, cover the picture on your gameboard with the card. Be the first player to cover the two different sequences on your gameboard and you'll win the game.

### OBJECT:

Be the first player to cover all the pictures in the two sequences on your gameboard with matching cards in exact order, from left to right.

### CONTENTS:

• 32 cards • 4 gameboards

### HOW TO SET UP THE GAME:

1. Give each player a gameboard. **Please note:** carefully remove any excess cardboard around gameboard edges.
2. Separate the cards and place them picture-side down between the players. Mix them up and form 4 rows of 8 cards each.

### HOW TO PLAY THE GAME:

1. Choose a player to go first. Play proceeds to the left.
2. Remember the 4 pictures in each sequence must be matched in exact order, from left to right only. Just follow the footsteps from 1 to 4.
3. On your turn, flip over any card of your choice. You must turn it completely over in place so all players may see it and try to memorize its location.
4. If the card you turn over **DOES NOT MATCH** the first picture in either sequence on your gameboard, turn the

card picture-side down again and your turn is over. **Please note:** If you turn over a card that matches a picture on your gameboard but it's not the first picture in the sequence, it must be turned picture-side down again and your turn is over. Remember pictures must be matched in sequence, from left to right only.

5. If the card you turn over **DOES MATCH** the first picture in either sequence on your gameboard, take the card and cover the matching picture with it.

6. After you cover the first picture in a sequence, try to cover the second picture, then the third and finally the fourth, in that order to complete the sequence. **Important:** you do not have to complete one sequence before you start the other sequence on your gameboard. For example, you may match the first and second pictures in the lower sequence then the first picture in the upper sequence, etc.

7. As long as you turn over a card that matches a picture in either sequence on your gameboard, in the proper order, your turn continues.

### HOW TO WIN THE GAME:

Be the first player to cover all the pictures on your gameboard, in the proper order, and you'll win the game!

### SOLO PLAY:

This is excellent practice for developing concentration and memory skills. Take one gameboard and the 8 cards that match the 8 pictures on that gameboard. Place the cards picture-side down in front of you, mix them up and arrange them in a circle. Play as directed above, but count the number of turns it takes you to cover all the pictures on your gameboard with matching cards.
