
FCC STATEMENT




PLAY INSTR' 'IONS:

"Knock Knock" . . . Potato Head® is ready to play with right out of the package! Here's how he works:


- I. Press the patch on Mr. Potato Head's cap he'll greet you, and then say "Knock Knock!"
- 2. From a few inches away, speak with a loud, clear voice directly into the patch on his cap and, of course, say "Who's there?!"
- Mr. Potato Head will then answer you by setting up the joke he'll say, for example, "Cargo!"



WHEN BATTERIES NEED REPLACEMENT:



I. "Knock Knock" Mr. Potato Head® comes equipped with 3 "AA" batteries. When the original batteries are exhausted, unfasten the flap in back and carefully remove the sound unit as shown. (Be careful not to break the wire which attaches the unit to the microphone in the hat.)



- Use a Phillips screwdriver to loosen and remove the screw that secures the battery compartment door, and remove the door.
- Insert 3 new "AA" (alkaline recommended) batteries into the compartment, following direction indicators inside compartment. Replace door and re-fasters with the screwdriver.
- 4. Place sound unit back inside Mr.
 Potato Head with the speaker
 facing out, and re-fasten the
 flap with the fasteners.

CAUTION: TO AVOID BATTERY LEAKAGE:

- Be sure to insert the batteries correctly and follow the toy and battery manufacturer's instructions.
- 2. Do not mix old and new batteries or alkaline, standard (carbon-zinc) or rechargeable batteries.
- 3. Always remove exhausted or dead batteries from the product.
