



Play Features

The Musical Pipes toy offers play in 2 different modes:



Mode I - Create a Song


- With a press of the button on the left, your child can create his or her own musical masterpiece!
- Each time a pipe is gently pressed, the sound of a slide whistle, boinger or piano note will play. Press the pipes to hear the sound in a different key. Press the left button to cycle through the different musical instrument sounds.
- Lights in each pipe will also illuminate to provide visual stimulation.

Mode 2 - Music

- Each time the button on the right is pressed, your child activates the music, and colorful lights flash as the music plays.
- Children can add their own special touch to a song by pressing any of the pipes to play one of 3 musicalinstrument sounds. Press the left button to cycle through the different sounds.
- Press the right button once to stop the song while it is playing.
- To move from one song to another, press the right button once to stop the song while it is playing. Then, press a second time to advance to the next song and light show. Or, wait until the music stops playing, then press the right button once to move to the next song.

To Replace Batteries

Use a Phillips/crosshead screwdriver to loosen screw in battery compartment door (screw remains attached to door). Insert 3 fresh "AA"/LR6 (I.5V) alkaline batteries. Replace door and tighten screw.



CAUTION: TO AVOID BATTERY LEAKAGE

- 1. Be sure to insert the batteries correctly and always follow the toy and battery manufacturers' instructions.
- 2. Do not mix old and new batteries or alkaline, standard (carbon-zinc) or rechargeable (nickel-cadmium) batteries.
- 3. Always remove weak or dead batteries from the product.

CAUTION:
