


A Message to Parents...

Art is a wonderful way for children to express their creativity and expand their imaginations. Outlined in this booklet are just some of the stimulating art projects that you and your child can work on together.

Because this activity toy is open-ended in nature, it will encourage experimentation, and assure that each creation will be uniquely successful. And to help ensure that your child's creative experience is a positive one, we suggest that you praise each effort, and display your child's artwork so that he or she will feel a sense of accomplishment.

As an added benefit, the play pattern will help develop fine motor skills, though at least in the beginning, an adult should provide the hands-on guidance needed to complete a project.

We sincerely hope that you and your child enjoy many happy hours exploring and creating with Spin 'n Paint. And, as with any child's toy, always remember that the most important step in achieving the maximum benefit is to ... HAVE FUN!



How To Use Spin 'n Paint...

Before starting, be sure to protect your work area with a plastic cloth or old newspaper.

- Lift up the design machine cover.
- Place a sheet of paper in the design machine compartment.
- Select a stencil and place it over the paper.
- Select one or more bottles of paint. Unscrew and remove cover from each bottle you use.
 Pop out the seal from inside the cover. Retighten bottle cover and discard seal. Shake the bottle several times before using paint. Remove cap from tip of bottle and pour paint into the marked areas. Add paint to marked areas until each is half full. Do not overfill.

Note: To ensure that the entire picture will be painted, be sure to fill all 3 marked areas with paint.

 Close the cover until it snaps shut. (Always keep cover closed when using toy.) Turn the knob clockwise to spray the paint; continue spraying until a light coating covers the paper.

- Note: Do not overspray; too heavy a coating will cause the paint on the paper to run and distort the design. When spray becomes too light and doesn't cover the paper, it's time to add more paint to the marked areas.
- Wait at least 30 seconds to allow paint to start drying. Then lift up the cover, grasp stencil by a corner and slowly remove it from the compartment. Rinse or wipe paint from your fingers, then remove paper from compartment. Look at the great design you've just created!

Cleaning Spin 'n Paint...

Be sure to keep the stencils and design machine clean.

After you are finished making designs, you will need to remove the leftover paint from all parts of the toy. First, remove cover from design machine by pushing against one side of the cover, and then the other to pop the hinge tabs out of the holes. Rinse paint from cover, design machine and stencils by running them under lukewarm water. Be sure all parts are completely dry before reusing.

Design-Making Ideas ...

You and your child can make all kinds of exciting creations with Spin 'n Paint! Here are some fun projects to help you get started.

Button Brights


- Find several large buttons, about 1 inch in diameter.
- Place a sheet of paper in the chamber, then arrange the buttons on the paper in whatever way you wish. Pour in the paint, turn the knob and start painting!
- Allow the paint to dry, then remove the buttons from the chamber. Next, remove the paper and look at the exciting design you've just created!

You can also do the above using sea shells, macaroni, fallen leaves and more!

Popsicle Stick Picture Frame

After you've created a painting, you can frame it!

- Glue 4 popsicle sticks together to make a square frame. (Popsicle sticks and glue not included.)
- Glue a completed painting to the backside of the frame.
- Decorate the frame with your own crayons, colored glue, glitter or any other creative accessories you wish!



Colorful Snowflake

- Place a sheet of paper into the chamber. Pour in the paint, turn the knob and start painting!
- Allow the paint to dry, then remover the paper from the chamber. Fold paper in half, then in half again.

- Use safety scissors (not included) to cut out little triangles and squares.
- Unfold the sheet of paper to reveal a colorful snowflake!

These are just a few of the fun projects you can do with Spin 'n Paint. But with a touch of imagination and a dash of creativity, you'll find that you and your child can make an endless number of unique and delightful designs!
