


Includes Spirograph desighn toy base storage case with built-in crayon sharpener, I gear ring, 3 gears, 3 crayons and paper.



TO USE MY FIRST SPIROGRAPH® DESIGN TOY



 Lift frame and position a sheet of paper inside the edge marks as shown.



Close frame. Place the large gear ring inside the teeth of the frame.



 Choose a gear and place it inside the gear ring. We recommend gear A to start.





4. Insert a crayon into one of the holes in the gear. Holding the crayon upright as shown, move the gear along the teeth on the inside of the gear ring, going around as many times as necessary to complete the design. Open the lid and remove the paper with the design on it.

You can also move the gears around the teeth inside the frame to create a frame design.

DESIGN CHOICES

To help you select a gear, take a look below at the samples of the designs you can make using each gear and each hole in the gears.






The set comes with a crayon sharpener. The sharpener can be used in or out of the case. Remove the paper from the crayon before sharpening. Pull the sharpener apart over a trashcan to empty it.

Open the case to store all the pieces neatly inside as shown.

Draw some details inside the design, if you like.


Here are some suggestions of pictures you can make using one design gear. How many more can you come up with?








MAKE PICTURES USING 2 DESIGN GEARS



Line the arrow on the gear ring with the arrow on the case, Choose gear C to make the head. Make a complete design with a crayon in hole 6.



Move the gear ring to the other arrow as shown. Choose gear A to make the body. Make a complete design with a crayon in hole 2.



Draw your own details inside and outside the design to complete your picture.
