Double "Berry" Talk™

The Fun 'n Fruity Recipe Game For 2 to 4 players/Ages 4 to 8

OBJECT Everyone who knows about Strawberryland knows about the Berry Birds. They're the feathered friends of the Purple Pieman, and they repeat everything they hear! Be a Berry Bird by matching each of the Fruit cards that are played. Then use that fruit to make up your very own recipe. The one with the fewest Fruit cards at the end of the game is the winner.

EQUIPMENT 1 "rules" card • 35 Fruit cards (7 apple cards, 7 raspberry cards, 7 cherry cards, 7 blueberry cards, and 7 Wild Fruit cards)

SET UP

- 1. Mix all the cards together.
- Deal 2 cards face down to each player. Then place the rest of the cards face down in a pile near the playing area. This is the draw pile.
- The youngest player goes first. Play then proceeds, in turn, to the first player's left.

PLAYING

The first player places one of his or her cards face up next to the draw pile. This is the discard pile. He or she then makes up a recipe that uses the fruit on the card that was played. For example, if an apple card was played, the player could say, "I'm making an apple pie." He or she then draws the top card from the draw pile and ends that turn.

Look at your cards. On your turn, you can be a Berry Bird by doing one of the following things:

 Match one of your Fruit cards to the last Fruit card played. Then make up a recipe that uses that fruit. For example, if the last player played an apple card and said. "I'm making an apple pie." play an apple card and make up your very own recipe, such as "I'm making a caramel-covered apple." Then draw the top card from the draw pile and end your turn.

OR

Play a Wild Fruit card onto the discard pile. This
card has every fruit on it, so it matches the last Fruit
card—or another Wild Fruit card! Say aloud the
fruit you're matching, then make up your very
own recipe that uses that fruit. Then draw the top
card from the draw pile and end your turn.

But if you can't be a Berry Bird and match the last card played, you have to "eat the recipes." Take all the cards in the discard pile and place them in a pile near you. Then make a new discard pile by playing any card from your hand. Make up a-recipe that uses the fruit on that card, then draw the top card from the draw pile and end your turn.

END OF GAME The game ands when there are no more cards left in the draw pile.

WINNING The player with the fewest cards at the end of the game is the winner. If two players he tor the fewest cards, you're both winners!
