



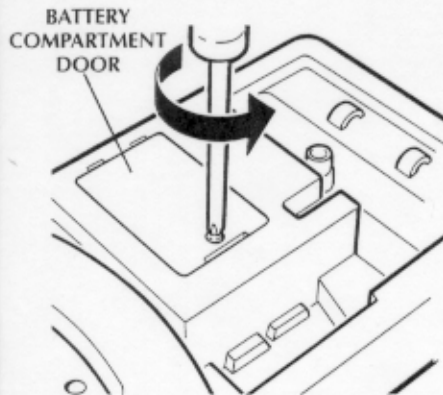
Talking Pay Phone

INSTRUCTIONS

Includes: Talking Pay Phone, receiver, 4 play coins and credit card.

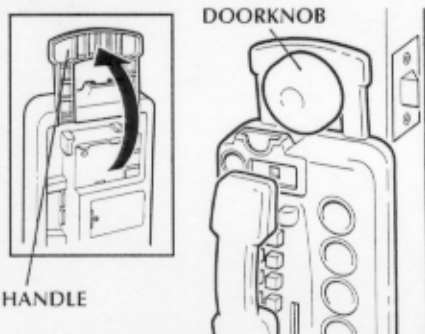
ADULT SUPERVISION REQUIRED. PHILLIPS SCREWDRIVER REQUIRED FOR BATTERY PLACEMENT.

The Talking Pay Phone comes equipped with button cell batteries. When these are exhausted, replace them with 3 "AA" batteries (alkaline recommended).



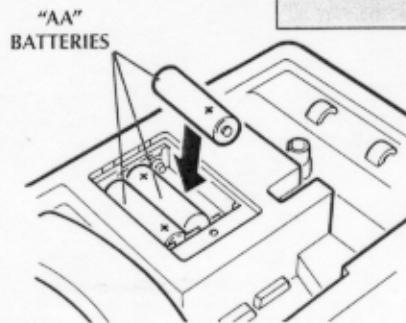
REPLACING THE BATTERIES:

The Talking Pay Phone comes equipped with 3 "AA" batteries. To replace batteries, use Phillips screwdriver to loosen screw that secures battery compartment door (in back of pay phone) and remove door.

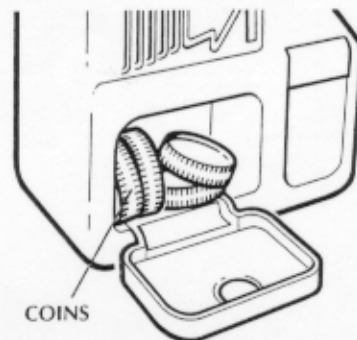


HANGING PAY PHONE:

Fold up handle in back of phone to hang from doorknob or wall.



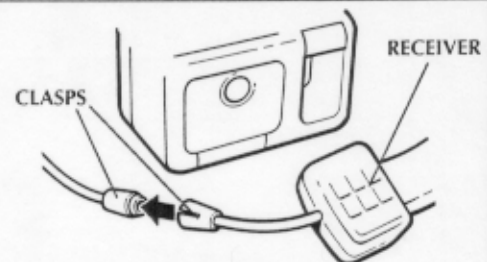
Insert 3 "AA" batteries following direction indicators inside compartment. Replace door and fasten screw.



When you're finished playing, the play coins may be stored in the bank.

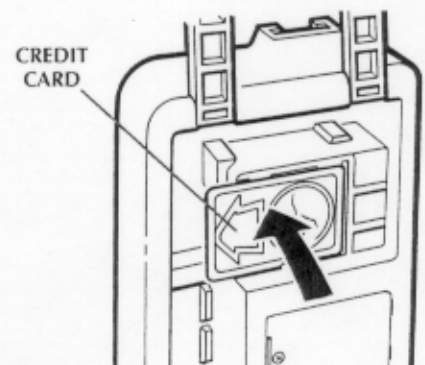
CAUTION: TO AVOID BATTERY LEAKAGE

1. Be sure to insert the batteries correctly and follow the toy and battery manufacturer's instructions.
2. Do not mix old and new batteries or alkaline, standard (carbon-zinc) or rechargeable (nickel-cadmium) batteries.
3. Always remove exhausted or dead batteries from the product.
4. Remove batteries if product is stored for a long period of time.



ATTACHING RECEIVER TO PAY PHONE:

To attach the receiver to its tether on pay phone, simply snap the clasps together as shown.



The credit card may be stored in its place in back of phone, above battery compartment.
