

OICE-ACTIVATED MOTORIZED, TALKING TRUCK



To replace batteries.




Loosen screw and remove battery compartment door from bottom of vehicle.



Install three "C" batteries into vehicle as shown. Replace battery compartment door and tighten screw.

CAUTION: To avoid battery leakage, (1) Be sure to insert the batteries correctly and always follow the toy and battery manufacturer's instructions. (2) Do not mix old and new batteries or alkaline, standard (carbon-zinc) or rechargeable batteries. (3) Always remove exhausted or dead batteries from the product.
