

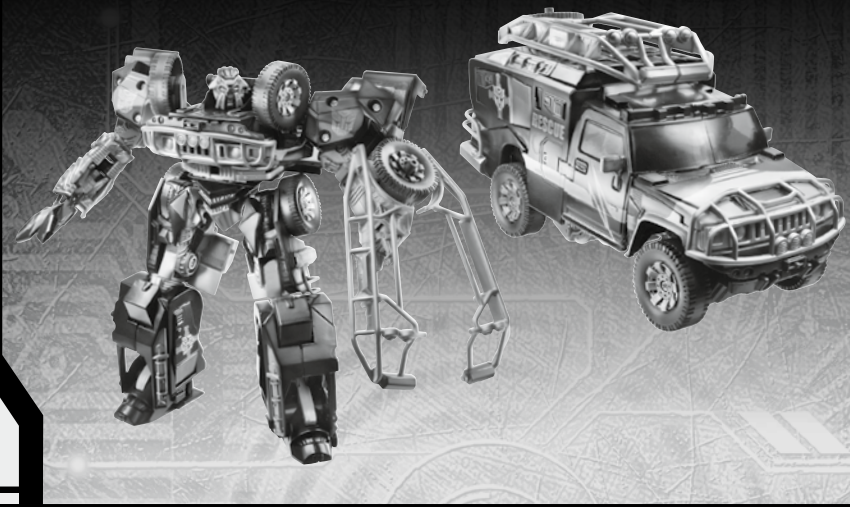

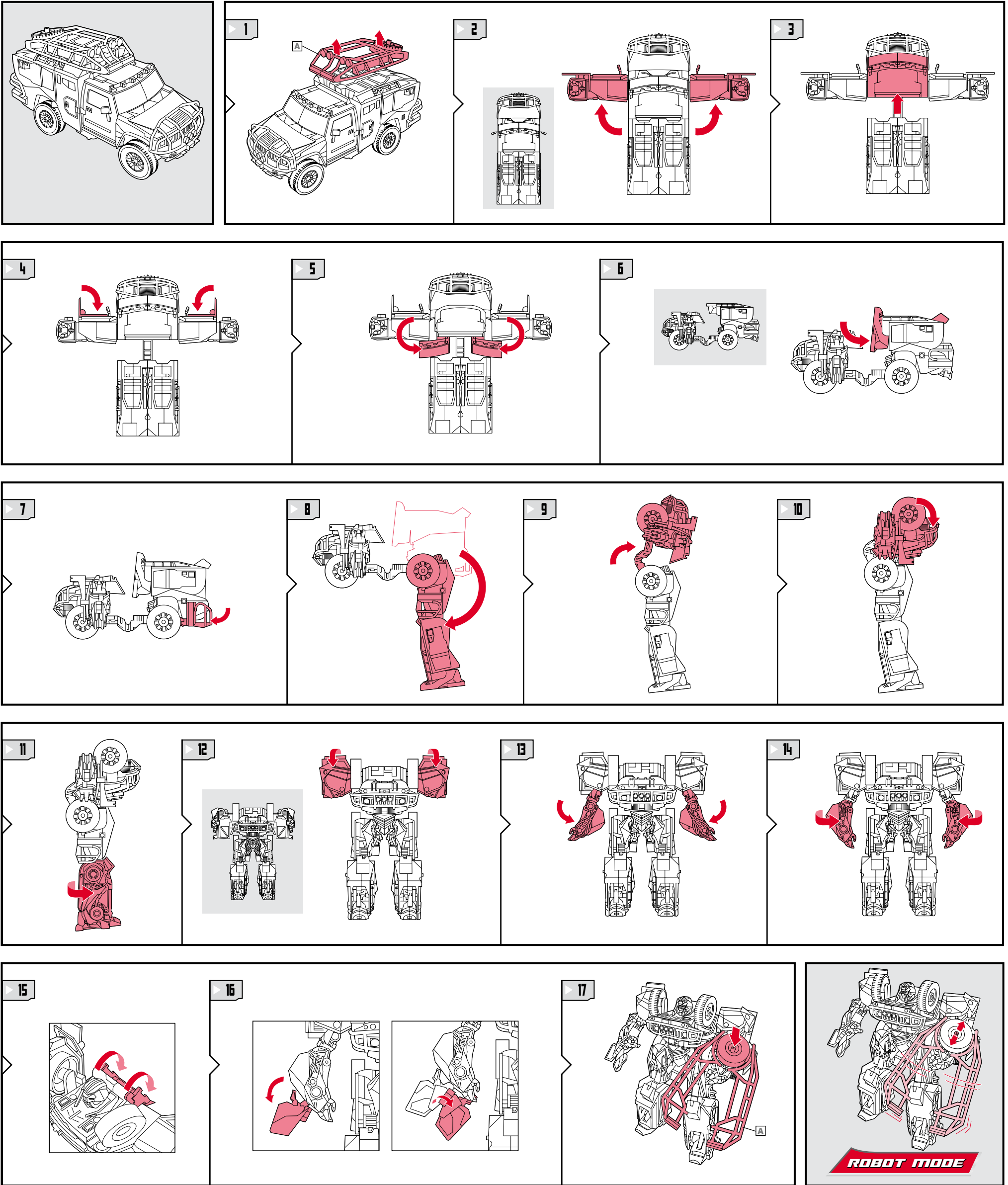
### CHANGING TO VEHICLE

**NIGHT OPS RATCHET**

1. Detach the red ladder frame (A) from the robot's back.
2. Attach the red ladder frame (A) to the robot's arms.
  1. Insert the red ladder frame into the arm socket.
  2. Push the red ladder frame into the arm socket.
  3. Rotate the red ladder frame to lock it in place.
3. Attach the red ladder frame to the robot's chest.
4. Attach the red ladder frame to the robot's legs.
5. Attach the red ladder frame to the robot's feet.
6. Attach the red ladder frame to the robot's hands.
7. Attach the red ladder frame to the robot's head.
8. Attach the red ladder frame to the robot's neck.
9. Attach the red ladder frame to the robot's torso.
10. Attach the red ladder frame to the robot's waist.
11. Attach the red ladder frame to the robot's hips.
12. Attach the red ladder frame to the robot's thighs.
13. Attach the red ladder frame to the robot's knees.
14. Attach the red ladder frame to the robot's ankles.
15. Attach the red ladder frame to the robot's feet.
16. Attach the red ladder frame to the robot's toes.
17. Attach the red ladder frame to the robot's heels.
